



To provide training on communication skills and public speaking experience. We further purpose to afford each contestant an opportunity to earn a college scholarship. This is accomplished through completion of all required phases of the contest, conveying intellectual thinking, and confident delivery of an original written and oral presentation on the selected theme. The goal of the scholarship award is for students to receive a one time financial assistance with tuition, books, housing and other related costs of attending an institution for higher education.

2 The National Baptist Oratorical Contest will be held in person, during the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education Annual Session on Wednesday, June 19, 2025, time to be determined. We have made several updates to this year's oratorical contest guidelines and rules. An overview of these updates are detailed in the following pages.

Serving God in an Al Age: How does Al (Artifical Intelligence) either help or hinder teenagers in serving God and sharing the Gospel

# Scripture: Romans 12:2

# O2 Qualifications

- / Be a member in good standing of a church that is currently registered with the National Baptist Convention, USA, Incorporated and the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education.
- / Hold membership in a state convention that has contributed to the national scholarship fund.
- / Currently be enrolled in high school with satisfactory progression toward graduation in the year the application is awarded or already matriculating in college.
- / The contestants will participate in a multiple-step process, including, but not limited to:
- Competing in their church's Oratorical Contest;
- Ompeting in their local District Association Oratorical Contest;
- Competing in their State Convention's Congress of Christian Education Oratorical Contest (the National Commission does not require that the contest is held during the State Convention; that is the decision of the individual State);
- The contestant chosen at the State level to compete in the National Baptist Congress Oratorical Contest may be sponsored by either his or her local church, the District or the State Convention.

# O3 Organization of Written Speech (Oration)

- / The Speech must Using the scripture and theme below: Write an speech about "Serving God in an AI Age". Scripture: Romans 12:2. How does AI (Artifical Intelligence) either help or hinder teenagers in serving God and sharing the Gospel
- The speech must be original prepared, and written by the contestant. The use of quotes and wording not by the oratorical contestant must be properly cited using the citation format of the orator's choosing.
- / The speech must be typewritten, organized, and submitted in a word document or PDF format in Times New Roman, 12 point black font, double-spaced.
- / The speech must progress logically, be correct in form and content, relevant, and address the established theme and scripture.
- / There should be no typographical or grammatical errors in the final submitted copy.
- / The speech must clearly document all references or copyrighted material cited in the oration. All supporting documentation must be neatly printed, complete, and accurate.
- The contestant's oration and supporting documentation, i.e., (contestant cover sheet, documentation submission form, electronic photo and the student's most recent report card) must be received from the State Congress President, the State Youth Director, or the State Director of the Oratorical Contest by May 14, 2025 at 11:59 PM via electronic version (email) and six paper copies of the Oration, the documentation submission form and the contestant cover sheet, are to be sent via postal submission to the Oratorical Coordinator postmarked May 14, 2025..

- Contestants written Oration

- / Electronic photo of contestant (please no copies of ID cards-this photo will be submitted for the website posting)



# **O5** Presentation of Oration



- / The Contestant must arrive one hour before contest starts and shall have a reference copy of their speech in the holding area prior to the start of the contest.
- The Contestants that place in the top three will meet with the Oratorical Coordinator, immediately following the contest, to complete all required documentation. At this time they will need their social security number for completion of the W9 tax form. The winner will be given instructions regarding their attendance at the Children/Youth Rally where they will be introduced and will recite the winning oration.
- / The Contestant's presentation attire is Males: Slacks, Suit Coats and Shirts with Ties and Females: Business Dresses or Suits with Hosiery (please note the contestants will be on an elevated platform facing the audience)
- / The Contestants are to stand, approach the podium, state the theme, their contestant number, their first and last name and begin their memorized rendition of the written oration, within the frame of the podium (without moving across the stage).
- / The Contestant's oratorical presentation must avoid speaking in sermonic/preaching tones, using testimonials, and excessive gesturing.
- Contestants are not allowed to use special props, costumes, or clothing to complement their oration.


# 06 Competition Checklist

- Successfully advance through church, local, and state contests.
  - **2** Ensure your church is registered to attend the National Baptist Convention, USA, Incorporated 2025 Annual Session.
  - 3 Complete application and email all required documents (i.e. written oration, most recent report card and headshot) by May 14, 2025 to compete at the national oratorical contest.
- A Have a state representative confirm your participation and placement in the state oratorical contest through email to gtorrancenbdoratorical@gmail.com May 14, 2025.
- 5 Receive confirmation of selection.

# **DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS**

- SERMONIC TONES refers to "whooping" or "singing" at the conclusion or during any part of the oration.
- / TESTIMONIALS refers to framing the body or content of the speech around a personal testimony/story. This decision is made at the judges' discretion.
- / EXCESSIVE GESTURING is determined at the judges' discretion contestant beware. Limit all movement, including your hands, as excessive gesturing or movement may result in disqualification.

# **O7** Instructions to Contestants



- The first place winner will receive \$3,000, the second place winner will receive \$2,000, and the third place winner will receive \$1,000. All participants will receive a \$100 gift card for their participation in the contest. The winners will be announced during Congress Session. All awards will be distributed through mail following the Congress.
- / The top three winning contestants will receive an email from the Oratorical Coordinator or designee immediately following the contest to complete all required documents to receive their award scholarship award (including mailing confirmation and W9 tax form). Be sure to respond in a timely manner.
- / Regardless of your opinion, the Judges' decision is final.
- / The judges are selected prior to the NBC Oratorical Contest. Each judge receives the guidelines and judge's score sheet during the judge's training session(s). Each judge is scheduled to attend a training teleconference prior to the Congress Session and will virtually attend a final review before the live contest. Each judge has attested to providing a fair and impartial scoring of each contestant.
- / The judges will use the following criteria to rank each oration: composition, subject matter, content, originality, delivery, memorization, vocal control, enunciation, pronunciation, presentation, and mastery of material. The oration must be memorized.
- / The judges will also give each contestant an intangible score (most commonly used to describe things that are not recognized but not easily quantified) and in the "event of a tie", the contestant with the highest intangible score will be the winning contestant.
